SURF REPORT

Church of the Holy Spirit



Hello Surfers!

We conclude our sermon series on the book of Hebrews today. So far this month we've considered the Supremacy of Christ, the Sympathy of Christ, the Salvation of Christ and today we consider the Sacrifice of Christ. I hope you've enjoyed our walk through of this complex book.

Our Old Testament reading today marks the resolution of the account of Job, emphasising themes of repentance, restoration and the sovereignty of God (Job 42:1-6,10-17). We note Job humbly acknowledging God's wisdom and his own limitations, repenting for questioning divine judgement. These passages highlight the importance of humility before God and the recognition that human understanding is limited in the face of divine will. It ends reinforcing themes of trust, restoration and the mystery of God's purpose in human suffering.

Today's psalm is a beautiful expression of praise, trust and God's deliverance (Ps. 34:1-8). In these verses King David commits to continually praising the Lord, exalting Him for His goodness, reflecting on how God delivered him from fear and trouble when he sought Him. It offers assurance that those who turn to God will not be ashamed. The key message in verse 8 is an invitation to personally experience God's goodness and mercy. It encourages believers to trust in God's protection, provision and His faithfulness in difficult times.

In our gospel reading for today we read the account of the healing of blind Bartimaeus (Mark 10:46-52). This emphasises for us faith, persistence and Jesus' power to bring restoration. Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, calls out to Jesus for mercy despite the crowd's attempts to silence him. His persistence demonstrates unwavering faith, and when Jesus calls him forward Bartimaeus throws off his cloak — a symbolic way of casting away his old life. This passages highlights the transformative power of faith and Jesus' compassion for those who seek Him, showing that faith can lead to profound healing and new life.

As mentioned earlier, today's sermon explores Jesus' sacrifice as the ultimate and eternal High Priest (Heb. 7:21-28). We know that Jesus' priesthood is established by God's oath, making it superior to the Levitical priesthood, which was based on lineage. For Jesus, however, we recognise His sinlessness impacts His sacrifice, making His the perfect, once-for-all sacrifice which brings about complete salvation and direct access to God. We explore these themes today, noting how Jesus' sacrifice is final, perfect, and transformative to those who will accept it.
