28TH APRIL 2024, FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER SURF REPORT



Hello Surfers!

Welcome to the Fifth Sunday of Easter. I love the words of this week's allocated prayer, particularly: "help us so to proclaim the good news of Your love, that all who hear it may be reconciled to You." It can be difficult for us to share the gospel with others, but this is the prime role of all Christians and a task we must take seriously.

Our Psalm reading today is a portion of King David's poem, the beginning of which Jesus proclaimed while He was nailed to the Cross (Ps. 22:26-32). These recorded prophetic words from King David state that the poor will be satisfied, the ends of the earth will turn to the Lord, and future generations will be told about Him. Surely this speaks to our sharing of the gospel with everyone.

Today's gospel reading comes again from the Apostle John, in which he records the 'farewell discourse' from Jesus before His arrest (Jn. 15:1-8). Jesus' analogy of Himself as the vine, God the Father as the gardener/pruner, and His followers as the branches is one that has been reflected in art and music across the centuries. Christians are empowered by Jesus to 'bear good fruit', but with the warning that those who do not will be burned. Shocking words, but unmistakably recorded as coming from our Lord as the imperative for Christian evangelism.

In the first of our New Testament readings we contemplate the interaction between the Apostle Philip and the Ethiopian eunuch on the road to Gaza (Acts 8:26-40). This man was an important official, meaning that Philip's approach of him may have been dangerous. However, compelled by the Holy Spirit, Philip ran near his chariot and listened as he read out loud the words of the Prophet Isaiah. Emboldened, Philip shared that this reading spoke about Jesus and told him the gospel.

We complete the sermon series of April today on the Apostle John's first letter to the church in Ephesus, with a particular focus on the love that comes from God (1 Jn. 4:4-21). If we were to fall into the trap of thinking sharing the gospel is a cold conveying of knowledge only, this reading sets us right. The gospel is nothing more than letting people know that God loves them, wants a genuine relationship with them, and – once we understand that – we are compelled to share this 'good news' with others.

Next weekend we are joined by Greg Guerroero who will be sharing with us the work of Voice of the Martyrs, which I am very much looking forward to hearing about. Empowering the persecuted church abroad is one of the most important things we can do with our resources. Also, next week is the Commemoration of the Battle of the Coral Sea and I will be heading off straight after the service to preside over their memorial.
